He was the founding director of the Liberty Center for Survivors of Torture, a federally funded project to raise awareness about survivors of torture and to provide survivors with health and legal case management. Formerly he was a program officer at The Philadelphia Foundation and coordinator of the Emma Lazarus Collaborative—a collaborative of foundations that supported service and advocacy for immigrants and refugees. He is the past co-chair of the Philadelphia Bar Association's International Human Rights Committee and served as legal officer with the UN High Commissioner for Refugees.
